Specialization in International Affairs is in demand

The scope of international relations and cooperation has grown exponentially in the past decades. States and organizations have a need for a growing number of people well versed in the various aspects of international affairs. This course of study prepares students for diverse careers, as well as for further studies.

Two lines of study are offered: International affairs as a full time masters program 120ECTS and as a part time Post Graduate Diploma 30ECTS.

Career prospects

A degree in international affairs from the University of Iceland opens the doors to varied and interesting career paths, including investigative journalism, diplomacy, government service, work in international organizations (such as the UN, EU, NATO etc.), think tanks, NGOs and the development sector, as well as academia.

A practical and diverse academic program

The program emphasizes the position of Iceland and other small states in the international system and their foreign affairs. A wide variety of electives is offered to students, including courses also taught in the Post-Graduate Diploma program in Small State Studies where teaching is based on extensive research on small states by internationally acknowledged. The program offers considerable flexibility yet aims to provide students with fundamental theoretical understanding of international affairs and the methodology of social sciences. The MA in International Affairs brings together rigorous academic studies and a practice-oriented approach that provides students with an in-depth understanding of both the theories and realities of world politics.

Admission requirements

BA, B.Ed., BS degree or equivalent qualification. For the MA degree students also need to have first class grades (7.25 out of 10). International applicants, whose native language is not English, are required to provide results of the TOEFL (79) or IELTS (6.5) tests as evidence of English proficiency.
